

# BRISTOL FERRY BOATS



## Family-Friendly Ferry Day Out!

**There are just so many things to see and do in Bristol it may feel like a day isn't long enough! However, here are some suggestions all within easy reach of the harbour, just ask our friendly crew for a Family Day Ticket.**

- A) If you're arriving into Bristol via the train, we have a sheltered ferry stop just two minutes away from behind the station! (17) Walk along the promenade towards the river and walk down the steps to the right of the bridge. If you have any push chairs, fold them up for easy boarding.**
- B) Younger kids always have a fantastic time either at We The Curious or Bristol Aquarium – ask to be dropped off at the City Centre (1) – both attractions are within two minutes walking distance of each other and the crew will be happy to direct you.**
- C) Feeling peckish? Head to Za Za Bazaar for an all you can eat buffet, or if you fancy a picnic in the sun either head to College Green by the Bristol Cathedral, or walk up Park Street and sit in Brandon Hill, which has fantastic views over the city.**
- D) Have a look at Hotwells! Walk down to the harbour to Gas Ferry North (3) - the stop within the inlet, past the steps and give the ferry a wave and they can take you up the harbour, past the colourful houses of Clifton Wood, see all the boats surrounding the Nova Scotia and Underfall Yard and take you back down for a glorious view of the bow of s.s. Great Britain, go past The Matthew (it's a pirate ship!) and stay on the boat to relax and return to the train station (17).**
